OLD BUSINESS

4. Lowes Pavilion Project
 - I. Lowes met with Ivy Ross and Roy Rieder.
 - II. The pavilion will be 100 yards from the old park's office in between the two soccer fields.
 - III. Project is looking to start in October.

5. Netting-American Legion Field-Barness Park
 - I. Public Works Department will be ordering the netting and installing themselves.
 - II. Netting for the third base line and behind home plate will be in the 2018 budget.
6. Bradford Reservoir playground project.
 - I. Ann Toole sent a response to the board of the possibility of this playground.
 - II. Ms. Toole suggested to wait for the Park and Recreation master plan to be finalized or if the board does decide to move forward with this project to create a master plan for this area.
 - III. Mr. Dolan questioned what should be done next.
 - IV. Mr. Luber recommended waiting for the Park and Recreation master plan before moving forward.
 - V. Mr. Luber will meet with Mr. Dolan and Joe Knox to look over the space and where to cut the grass lower.

NEW BUSINESS

7. Organized sports at Lower Nike Park (Roller Hockey)
 - I. Ms. Winslow received a permit request for a roller hockey league. Mr. Luber asked the board if Lower Nike was just used for pick-up games only and not organized sports.
 - II. Mr. Piotrowicz made a motion to allow Lower Nike Park to be used for organized sports, Mr. McNulty seconded the motion. This motion passed with a vote of 5-0.
8. Field use/reserving of fields
 - I. Warrington Football's fields are being damaged due to pick-up football games.
 - II. Mr. Luber asked for suggestions of what the policy should be of monopolizing fields for sport organizations?
 - III. The board suggested having Warrington Football attend the next meeting and address this issue.
9. Vendors in Public Parks
 - I. There was a request for hotdog vendor to go to public parks to operate. The question was asked if the board can band the vendor from going to public parks.
 - II. The board stated that they do not want the hot dog vendor in the park where food is sold to raise money for sports teams.
 - III. Ms. Yannich informed the board that if the man is a veteran he may have the right to sell anywhere.
 - IV. Ms. Rice asked to find out if he is a veteran and to obtain more information before making a decision.

1. Warrington Day Update
 - I. Mr. Luber informed the board that they should get a schedule together for their booth at Warrington Day.
