

## Warrington Township Police





The Warrington Township Police Department, as part of a nine agency collaboration, is evaluating the implementation of a body-worn camera system to be used by officers and determine possible limits on their use. We are working to engage the community and evaluate residents' opinions on issues related to body cameras and their use.

## **Current Camera System**



- WTPD already has cameras mounted in all marked patrol vehicles
- The Mobile Video Recorders record traffic stops, pursuits, people in the back seats of the patrol vehicle and police encounters directly in front of the patrol vehicle
- Video from these incidents are available for review by supervisors and can be used in court
- WTPD has not yet deployed a Body-Worn Camera program

## **Next Steps by the Collaboration**

- Evaluation of community issues and concerns
- Develop policy regarding when and how a body camera is worn
- Selection of type of body camera system to use
- Evaluation of feasibility, logistics and costs involved for video storage
- Recommendation to governing bodies on outcomes
