



CHAIRMAN'S CORNER

Twin Oaks Day Camp - After months of public discussion and a recommendation of the Parks & Recreation Committee, The Board of Supervisors voted not to continue the Twin Oaks Day Camp next year. "It will take a lot of money to fix up the camp to the standards that we would like and frankly, we have not had the camp attendance to warrant that kind of investment", commented Supervisor Paul. A few years ago there were over 200 campers on an average week. Over the last two years, camp attendance averaged 50 campers on some days and as few as 15 on others. Look for future discussions concerning the reuse of Twin Oaks at future Board of Supervisors meetings.



Trail System - The Board last evening awarded a contract to S & H Landscapers of Chalfont in the amount of \$279,151.12 to construct a 1.2 mile walking trail along the PECO Right-of-Way. The trail will start near County Line Road and end near Street Road. This is one part of the overall plan to increase walkability throughout the Township. The goal is to provide pedestrian access from many residential areas to portions of the Township's parks. Chairman Anderson stated Warrington Township has been working on a trail system for twenty five years.

Willow Knoll Neighborhood - As has been the case for the last few meetings, several residents from the Willow Knoll neighborhood were present to talk about many issues such as parking, trash and loitering in their neighborhood. Chairperson Anderson reported that the Township has begun to make improvements and will continue to do so until the neighborhood is cleaned up. Street Sweeping, trash removal, and a stronger Police presence have already begun. A couple of the residents commented that they have already seen an improvement. Mr. Anderson assured the residents that the improvements will continue.

Improvements to Traffic Flow along Easton Road - The new Adaptive Signals that were installed between County Line and Bristol Roads are working as designed. Traffic along Easton Road is moving much better. PennDot is still monitoring the system and will continue to make tweaks to the system in order to reduce congestion on the side streets such as Street Road and Bristol Road.

Public Hearing – A continuation of the Public hearing has been scheduled for October 21, 2015 at 7:30 pm at Central Bucks South High School, 1100 Folly Road, Warrington. The hearing is in regards to Sunlit Farms, also known as the Geerling Tract, located at 3091 Street Road. The Board of Supervisors is encouraging any interested citizens to come to the hearing and participate if they choose. The owner intends to build single family houses on this property.



Change in Venue for next Board of Supervisors Meeting - In order to show case the recently completed Department of Public Works Facility, the Board has invited residents to a ribbon cutting ceremony at 6:00 pm on September 22nd. The new building is located at 3361 Pickertown Road, Chalfont. A ribbon cutting and Bar-B-Que will take place during this time. The regular Board of Supervisors meeting will begin at 7:30 pm.
