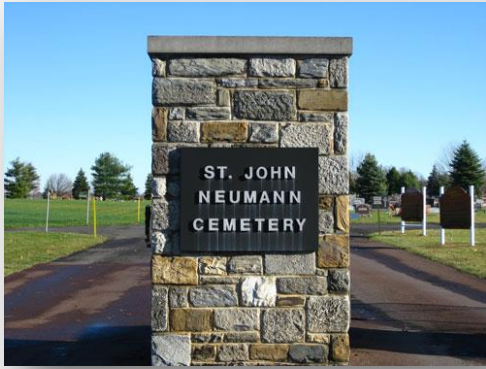


# CHAIRMAN'S CORNER
