

Introducing the FALCON

Warrington Township is the only municipality to have an asphalt recycling machine called the FALCON.



The Public Works Department is hard at work filling in potholes with their new FALCON. The FALCON can remelt old, torn up asphalt and keep it hot for reuse in permanently filling and sealing potholes even on a cold day.

This new machine is saving taxpayers' money. Since township employees are not spending time filling potholes with cold patch and then returning to the same pothole with hot asphalt this new method is saving labor costs and well as asphalt costs.

Hot asphalt is not available from December until April. Only, cold patch is available during those months from the quarry.

Vice Chairman John Paul said "with this machine, we can make our own hot asphalt and do repairs any time we want to. It is an efficient way to repair these dangerous potholes and it extends the overall duration of the repair."
