# 2019 Water and Sewer Bills

The Board of Supervisors approved Water Rate and Sewer Rate adjustments in conjunction with the 2019 Budget. These adjustments reflect increased costs in our water purchase from North Wales Water Authority, the acquisition of a PENNVEST loan to install filtration systems on four (4) public wells not covered by our Cooperative Agreement with the Air National Guard, and a Bond Issue to proceed with a Meter Replacement program and the final phase of the Palomino Farms Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project.

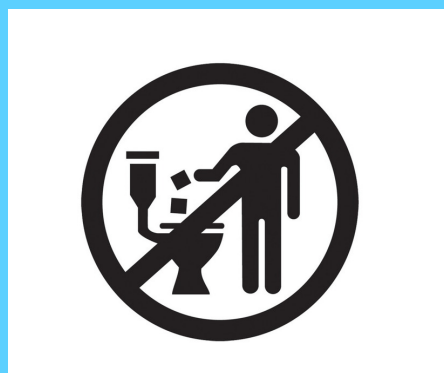

# What not to flush

Calling a plumber to take a look at a clogged toilet or drain can be expensive and quite a hassle. Even though it may seem like common sense what can and can't be flushed and put down the drain, this is a topic that is often overlooked or taken for granted. - Paper towels

The Township offers a water conversation ruler that shows how a water stream the size of 1/16" could add, over a three month time, an additional 74,000 gallons to your bill. Rulers can be found at the Township Administration Building.

**Handy Tips To Conserve Water**

- Take shorter showers
- Do only full loads of wash
- Run dishwasher only when fully loaded
- Water lawn & garden as needed, early AM

● 1/4"	1,181,500	158,000	4,475
● 3/16"	666,000	89,031	2,521
● 1/8"	296,000	39,400	1,115
● 1/16"	74,000	9,850	280

↑ A continuous leak from a hole this size would, over a three month period, waste water in the amounts shown above.
